'08-'09 Leadership Institute Underway

The '08-'09 edition of the Davis Chamber Leadership Institute is underway. One dozen promising business managers from Davis County have enrolled in this 6-month program to learn leadership, organizational, and marketing skills from some of the most effective and successful business leaders in Utah. In addition, they will compare management techniques, evaluate current economic trends, and review best-selling management books. They will also tour local businesses and government facilities.

The Davis Chamber Leadership Institute will meet once a month through next April. Scheduled highlights of the program include on-site presentations with the CEOs of Futura Industries, Davis Hospital, and the Davis Business Alliance. The group will also tour Hill Air Force Base, Davis County Correctional Facility and Capitol Hill.

Their visit to the Capitol also features presentations from Davis County Legislators and Governor Jon Huntsman.

Davis Chamber Expands Legislative Impact of Local Businesses

When a group of Wasatch Front businesses wanted to ensure they didn't lose their long-standing telephone numbers in the upcoming area code realignment, they turned first and foremost to the Chamber of Commerce for help. Similar local business groups have turned to the Davis Chamber for help with transportation improvements, health care cost management, immigration policy reform, and property tax assessment revision...and that's just in the past year. They know that impacting business-related legislation is one of the key services that Chambers of Commerce provide to their members and to the business community at large.

The Davis Chamber of Commerce looks to its Legislative Affairs Committee to determine its public policy and to handle member requests to engage in particular issues. There are 60 members of the Legislative Affairs Committee and they are currently gearing up for the 2009 legislative session on Capitol Hill in Salt Lake City. They have already passed the 2009 Public Policy agenda for the Davis Chamber. This document states the broad issues and positions that the Chamber will champion moving forward.

Once the session starts in late January, the committee will meet twice a week to carry out its business. The committee will meet at the Chamber offices in Kaysville each Wednesday afternoon during the session to determine their position on hundreds of specific bills that will be presented for Legislative consideration. Using their Public Policy Agenda as a guideline, the committee will adopt a Support, Oppose, or Monitor position on the bills presented. Those positions are then presented to Davis County legislators at the Capitol on the following morning. They know attendance at those meetings is a highly effective way to gauge the sense of the business community regarding the bills before them.

The Davis Chamber appreciates the attendance and support of our legislators at those meetings and is anxious to continue our strong working relationship with local elected officials. Brad Mortensen of Weber State University—Davis Campus will Chair the Davis Chamber Legislative Affairs Committee in 2009.
